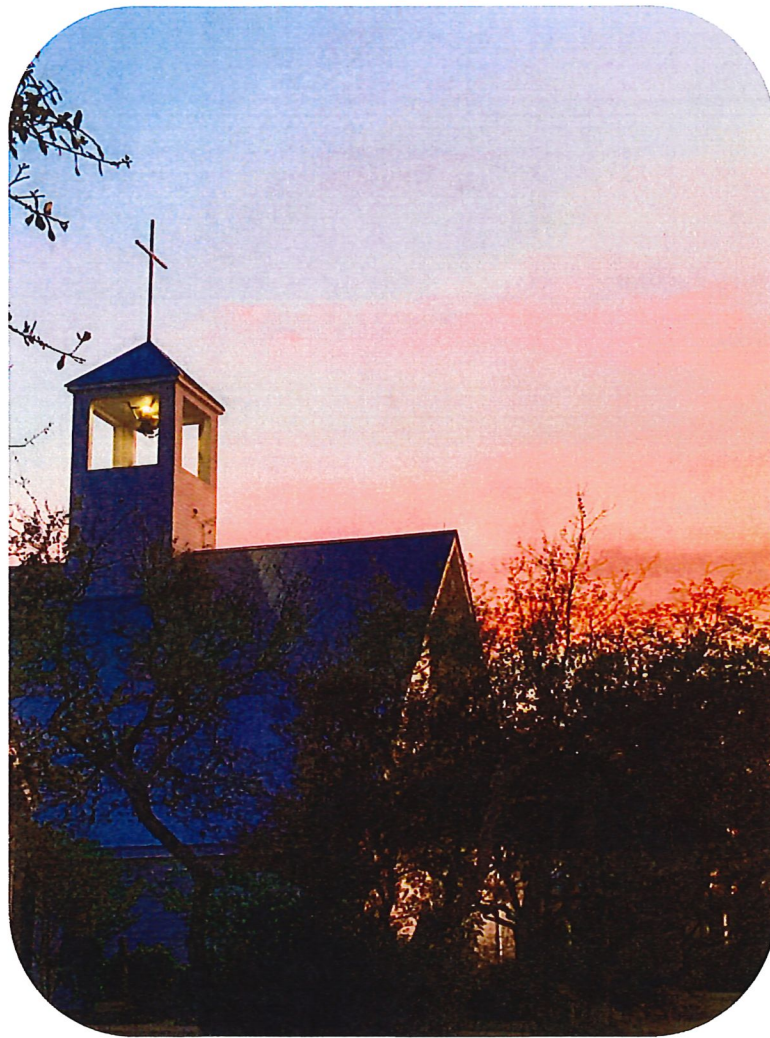

"The Lord is my helper;

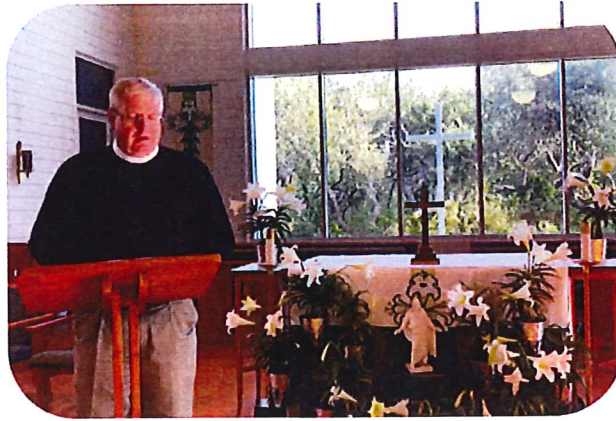
I will not be afraid.
